

## Sun cream Procedure

### Morning snack time & in the Afternoon @ 1.30pm 3.30pm

Cream your children in your classroom/zone

Where possible encourage each child to apply their own – use limited contact

Wash your hands between each application to a child

Check the list on reverse of who has their OWN sun cream

If applying lotion when outside – do this in the shade

Use the sun sticks for faces avoiding their eyes. Remember backs of necks, tops of ears and chests

Use pea size amounts & always rub cream in

Cover bare shoulders in t shirts if they are wearing strappy tops





ALL CHILDREN MUST WEAR A HAT NO HAT = NO OUTDOOR PLAY

This includes the Wetroom + Playroom outdoor areas

### Sun Protection Outdoor Workers Procedure

#### Protective sun wear must be worn by all staff on warm days

This is not only to protect themselves but shows them to be a positive role model to the children

Staff will have access to protective clothing including hats, sunglasses, long sleeved t-shirts and

sun cream

Staff can provide their own protective clothing but this is done at their own expense

Foot Wear: - No Flip Flops sandals with an ankle strap may be worn

All staff will read and follow the Sun Cream Procedure, Sun Protection, Out Door Worker Policy,
Warm Weather

# **Sun Protection**

This setting will protect children from the sun whilst using the outdoor play area. We are committed to providing the children with the opportunity to access outdoors whilst safeguarding them from the harmful rays of the sun.

The sun club will provide hypoallergenic, dermatologically tested, factor 30/50 sun sensitive cream.

The cream will be applied to the child mid morning and mid afternoon.

Parents will be asked to cream their child before the child arrives at nursery.

Children that are allergic to the lotion can provide their own sun cream, clearly labelled with the child's name.

Baseball caps will be provided by the setting and every child will be encouraged to wear one whilst using the outdoor play area —we will use the rule "no hat — no outdoor play"

In some circumstances Children will not use the outdoor area during the hottest part of the day.

Sun shades and canopies will be erected to keep parts of the garden shaded.

Indoor rooms will have a warm weather plan to keep the rooms well ventilated and cool.

If a parent refuses to sign the consent form, the management will arrange a meeting to resolve the matter.
